## K-1/K-2 Fiancé(e) Visa Instructions

Dear applicant,



This office has received an approved I-129F petition for you and is ready to begin your visa process. Please read and follow the instructions very carefully. Failure to do so will result in your visa process being delayed or your visa being refused at the interview.

IV Consolidation Applicants from **Croatia**, **Slovakia**, **Slovenia**, **Cyprus**, or **the Netherlands**, should additionally review the information posted at <u>ustraveldocs.com</u>.

## **Step 1: Complete & Submit Your Online Application Form DS-160**

Complete the <u>DS-160 "Nonimmigrant Visa Application Form" online</u> for each applicant, save and print the confirmation page. **IMPORTANT**, please select "**Frankfurt**" as the processing post. Once completed, please submit the DS-160 confirmation page to us as PDF using our <u>Visa Navigator</u>. Please go to "Immigrant Visas" and proceed to "Provide or update my DS-260/ DS-160".

## Step 2: Pay K-1 Fee, Choose Visa Delivery Method & Schedule Interview Appointment

Go to <u>usvisascheduling.com</u> and create an account. This website will allow you to pay the K-1 visa processing fee, select a visa delivery method, and submit an appointment request for your visa interview. Choose your visa delivery method **before** your appointment. Registering provides us with the information we need to return your passport and visa to you after your interview.

As soon as our office has received your DS-160 confirmation page via email (**Step 1**), you have successfully paid the K-1 visa fee and submitted an appointment request, our office will be able to approve your appointment request.

## **Step 3: Complete Your Pre-interview Checklist**

Prior to scheduling your appointment, you must obtain all documents listed below that pertain to your case (even if they were previously submitted to USCIS or NVC) and bring them to your visa interview. DO NOT send them to this office by mail. Please refer to the <u>Document Finder</u> to learn about the civil document requirements for each country. You must be prepared to present the <u>originals of all civil documents plus one copy each</u>. The originals will be returned to you after the visa interview.


Please note that all documents not written in English or German, must be accompanied by certified translations.

Passport: Your unexpired passport must be valid for six (6) months beyond your
intended date of entry to the United States.
<b>Proof of prior U.S. visas</b> : If you have been issued any type of non-immigrant visa to the
United States (for example, tourist, student, or work visas) bring your passport
containing the visa to your interview.
Birth Certificate: You and each family member immigrating with you must obtain an
original birth certificate or certified copy. The date and place of birth, and parent(s)
name(s) must be shown on the birth certificate. If you or any of your children were
adopted, you must also submit a certified copy of the final adoption decree.
<b>Divorce or death certificate(s)</b> of any previous spouse(s) for <b>both you and the U.S.</b>

**Note:** Present and former residents of the United States do NOT need to submit any U.S. police certificates.

Important: Police certificates expire after two years, unless the certificate was issued from your country of previous residence, and you have not returned there since the police certificate was issued.



**IMPORTANT**: No advance assurance can be given when or whether your visa will be issued. You should NOT resign from your place of employment, sell property, or make any final travel arrangements until the visa has been issued and is in your possession.
